CALL TO ORDER: Chairperson Swenson called the meeting to order at 8:30 am.

AGENDA REVIEW: There were no changes made to the agenda.

MINUTES APPROVAL:

SCHEDULING: The Upcoming Meetings Schedule was discussed and updated.

ADOPTION OF THE 2015-2019 GUNNISON COUNTY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN: County Attorney David Baumgarten and Deputy County Manager Marlene Crosby were present for discussion.

Moved by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to adopt the 2015-2019 Gunnison County Capital Improvement Plan. Motion carried unanimously.

BOUNDARY LINE ADJUSTMENT; MEISSNER/MCMAHON, BUSH VENTURES AND HEADLEE PROPERTIES: Community Development Director Russ Forrest and Planner Cathie Pagano were present for discussion. Planner Pagano explained that the properties are adjacent to the Wilder on the Taylor property, and that the adjustment would result in parcels just over one acre in size. **Moved** by Commissioner Houck, seconded, by Commissioner Chamberland to approve the Boundary Line Adjustment. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION; ADOPTING THE GUNNISON/CRESTED BUTTE INDUSTRIAL SPECIAL AREA, SPECIAL AREA REGULATIONS AND SPECIAL AREA MAPS: Community Development Director Forrest and County Attorney Baumgarten were present for discussion. **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to approve Resolution #2014-15, a Resolution Adopting the Gunnison/Crested Butte Industrial Special Area, Special Area Regulations and Special Area Maps. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION; APPROVING THE TRANSFER OF GUNNISON COUNTY OIL AND GAS PERMITS AND AGREEMENTS FROM GUNNISON ENERGY CORPORATION TO GUNNISON ENERGY, LLC: Community Development Director Forrest, Assistant Community Development Director Neal Starkebaum and County Attorney Baumgarten were present for discussion. Assistant Community Development Director Starkebaum explained that the Gunnison County Land Use Resolution allows for the transfer of permits and agreements. **Moved** by Commissioner Houck, seconded by Commissioner Chamberland to approve Resolution #2014-16, a Resolution Approving the Transfer of Gunnison County Oil and Gas Permits and Agreements from Gunnison Energy Corporation to Gunnison Energy, LLC. Motion carried unanimously.

DEPUTY COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT AND PROJECT UPDATES: Deputy County Manager Crosby, Community Development Director Forrest, County Attorney Baumgarten and Building/Environmental Health Official Crystal Lambert were present for discussion.

1. Grants of Perpetual Easement; Antelope Hills Water Line Project; Construction, Installation, Use and Maintenance of an Underground Water Line System. Deputy County Manager Crosby informed the Board that several additional easements are pending. **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to approve the perpetual easements for the Antelope Hills Water Line Project with Bruce and Freida Allen for \$2,500, BAMP, LLC for \$10, Antelope Hills Association, Inc. for \$10, and Construction, LLC for \$5,000. Deputy County Manager Crosby noted that Construction, LLC is owned by Fred and Valerie Schmalz. Motion carried unanimously.

2. Bridge Inspections. Deputy County Manager Crosby informed the Board that inspectors were in the process of completing bi-annual inspections for all of the bridge structures in excess of 20'-0" in span. One structure revealed a significant crack and significant deterioration in the concrete, while the rebar and wires are still intact. The inspectors recommended that the County cordon off the shoulder so that access is denied, and the County complied with this request on 6/30. The cordon will remain until the water recedes enough to allow a full evaluation.
3. Cumberland Pass Bridges. Deputy County Manager Crosby informed the Board that she is working to develop an agreement with the Forest Service for work on these bridges.
4. Road Damage Issues. Deputy County Manager Crosby informed the Board that there has been damage to the campground on White Pine Road and at Avery above Gothic, both of which qualify for flood repair funding. The Forest Service will need agreements in place before the damage can be repaired, and the agreements are due by 7/15. She asked for permission for the County Manager's signature on the agreements as soon as they are available. **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to approve and authorize County Manager Birnie's signature on the contract. Motion carried unanimously.
5. Pass Updates. Deputy County Manager Crosby informed the Board that magnesium chloride would be applied to Cottonwood Pass before the end of the day, and that the lower three miles of Kebler Pass would also be receiving an application. A towing company will remove abandoned vehicles that are in the way, and the vehicles will be held for 60 days before being scrapped.

COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT: County Manager Birnie was present for discussion. This began earlier than scheduled due to a gap in the meeting.

1. National Citizen Survey Award Nominations. County Manager Birnie informed the Board that the County has been nominated for two awards, one in the "Transformation in Built Environment" category and one in the "Mobility" category, and that the awards will be announced in mid-July.
2. Staff Changes. County Manager Birnie informed the Board that Adriana Villalobos resigned on 6/30, which will create coverage issues for his office until a replacement has been hired.
3. Courthouse Project Update. County Manager Birnie informed the Board that all activities in the field are going well, and that the agreement for the guaranteed maximum price would be signed on 7/2.

4. 4H Forever Fund. **Moved** by Commissioner Houck, seconded by Commissioner Chamberland to continue with the matching of the funds raised by the kids up to \$2,500 for the 4H Forever Fund. Motion carried unanimously.

COMMISSIONER ITEMS: This discussion began earlier than scheduled due to a gap in the meeting.

Commissioner Chamberland:

1. Roundtable Meeting in Aspen, CO; 6/30/14. Commissioner Chamberland informed the Board that he and Community Development Director Russ Forrest attended this meeting, along with Governor Hickenlooper and members of his staff. Commissioner Chamberland will provide written materials to the Board at a later time. The discussions included topics such as broadband. He will keep the Board posted.
2. Achieving Redundancy in Broadband. Commissioner Chamberland informed the Board that he has discussed this issue with a couple of companies. Discussions will continue.

BREAK: The meeting recessed from 9:03 until 9:08 am in order to hold the below Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING; PROPOSED GUNNISON COUNTY ON-SITE WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEM (OWTS) REGULATIONS (FORMERLY GUNNISON COUNTY ISDS REGULATIONS):

Community Development Director Forrest, Building/Environmental Health Official Crystal Lambert and County Attorney David Baumgarten were present for discussion.

1. Open Public Hearing. Chairperson Swenson opened the Public Hearing at 9:03 am.
2. Public Notice Confirmation. Building/EH Official Lambert confirmed that the Public Hearing had been properly public noticed.
3. Identify Ex Parte Communications. There were no ex parte communications identified.
4. Staff Presentation. Building/EH Official Lambert stated that she has been working with the Environmental Health Board to create regulations that are no less stringent than what Amendment 43 mandates. She noted that the most substantial change is that the application process will require additional preliminary work, but that the additional work should equate to a faster turnaround. Another minor change is the introduction of a vault system. There have been open house meetings with contractors, five public hearings with the Environmental Health Board, two open house events, and the work session with the Board on 5/13/14. Her office worked with the County Attorney's Office to develop the regulations. Community Development Director Forrest stated that the Environmental Health Board recommended approval, and Building/EH Official Lambert informed the Board that the State is in agreement with the changes.
5. Applicant Presentation. N/A.
6. Board Questions. The Board did not have any questions.
7. Public Comments. Chairperson Swenson opened the Public Hearing to comments at 9:08 am, and no comments were provided.
8. Acknowledge Correspondence Received. No additional correspondence was identified.
9. Applicant Response. N/A.
10. Close Public Hearing. Chairperson Swenson closed the Public Hearing at 9:08 am and immediately reconvened the Gunnison County Board of County Commissioners Meeting.

RESOLUTION; ADOPTING THE "GUNNISON COUNTY, COLORADO ON-SITE WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEM REGULATIONS": **Moved** by Commissioner Houck, seconded by Commissioner Chamberland to approve Resolution #2014-17, a Resolution Adopting the "Gunnison County, Colorado On-Site Wastewater Treatment System Regulations". Motion carried unanimously.

COMMISSIONER ITEMS (continued):

Commissioner Houck:

1. Tincup Travel Issues. Commissioner Houck informed the Board that he and Gunnison National Forest District Ranger John Murphy traveled to Tincup last week. He believes that the previously identified signage issues have been addressed by Public Works.
2. Meeting with Colorado State University (CSU) President Tony Frank. Commissioner Houck informed the Board that he and County Manager Birnie met with Mr. Frank during the previous week. The discussion included the beneficial partnership between CSU and the County.

3. City of Gunnison Comprehensive Plan. Commissioner Houck informed the Board that the City has asked him to participate in this process, and he agreed. He will update the Board as the process continues. The project is estimated to be complete within the next couple of years.

Commissioner Swenson:

1. Gunnison Sage-grouse Meetings. Chairperson Swenson informed the Board that she met with Noreen Walsh, Regional Director of the Mountain-Prairie Region of the US Fish and Wildlife Service, in Buena Vista on 6/20 to discuss this issue. Commissioner Houck and Gunnison Wildlife Conservation Coordinator Jim Cochran are scheduled to speak with Ms. Walsh on 7/3 regarding the downfalls of compensatory mitigation and other suggested options. She also had lunch with Department of Natural Resources Executive Director Mike King on 6/18 to continue discussions related to a conservation easement.
2. Gunnison-Crested Butte Chamber of Commerce, Crested Butte / Mt. Crested Butte Chamber of Commerce, Gunnison-Crested Butte Tourism Association, and Facilitators Marv and Marty Weidner; Facilitation Meetings. Chairperson Swenson informed the Board that she and Community Development Director Forrest met with this group yesterday, and that four working results and related services have been identified as a result of the facilitated meetings.

BREAK: The meeting recessed from 9:23 until 9:29 am for a short break, and then again from 9:29 until 9:49 am in order to hold the below Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING; DRAFT REGULATIONS FOR MARIJUANA CULTIVATION, MANUFACTURING, AND TESTING FACILITIES IN UNINCORPORATED GUNNISON COUNTY: Community Development Director Forrest and County Attorney Baumgarten were present for discussion.

1. Open Public Hearing. Chairperson Swenson opened the Public Hearing at 9:29 am.
2. Public Notice Confirmation. Community Development Director Forrest confirmed that the Public Hearing had been properly public noticed.
3. Identify Ex Parte Communications. There were no ex parte communications identified.
4. Staff Presentation. Community Development Director Forrest explained that the Board would be asked to take action on three separate resolutions; one to create licensing regulations, one to amend the Gunnison County Land Use Resolution, and one to allow marijuana facilities to operate in the Gold Basin Industrial Park. He stated that the Planning Commission had met to discuss the proposed regulations and modifications after Gunnison County voted in favor of Amendment 64 in November 2012. The process of performing criminal background checks with the State is still being discussed and is not ready for Board action. He noted that he received comments from the Crested Butte Fire District yesterday, and that he hasn't had time to fully review those comments, but that the Board would have time to review each application coming before the Board for approval with the full opportunity to provide their thoughts in each instance, as would the Fire District. Lastly, he confirmed that the Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval for the LUR changes and the Gold Basin Industrial Park resolution last week.
5. Applicant Presentation. N/A.
6. Board Questions. Commissioner Chamberland asked if the regulations had adequately addressed enforcement in the event that a neighbor complains about the smell. Community Development Director Forrest assured him that there are a variety of remedies that the County can utilize if enforcement issues arise.
7. Public Comments. Chairperson Swenson opened the Public Hearing to comments at 9:40 am.

Mr. Lou Costello introduced himself as a long-time resident dating back to the 1950's. He asked the Board to approve the resolutions because he feels that the use meets all stated requirements of the Industrial Park, will create jobs, and will create tax revenue. He submitted an application to the State in June, and he read aloud an excerpt from an interview that Telluride Sheriff Bill Masters recently participated in that indicated that there were no detox arrests made during this year's Bluegrass Festival.

Mr. Gary Fabiano introduced himself as a long-time resident dating back to the mid-1960's. He encouraged allowing marijuana facilities in all industrial parks within the County.

8. Acknowledge Correspondence Received. No additional correspondence was identified.
9. Applicant Response. Community Development Director Forrest stated that, as proposed, the license process would take 14 days. County Manager Birnie explained that the County would collect a 0.5% sales tax as a result of sales at retail locations within the municipalities, which would be dedicated to capital projects and wouldn't be available for law enforcement or administration related to the industry. He also explained that, at this time, the County does not have the authority

to tax a specific industry, but that there are efforts being discussed among the counties at Colorado Counties, Inc. regarding possible legislation that would allow the taxing of an industry. If authorized, those taxes would be used to mitigate the impacts of the industry. Chairperson Swenson stated the County would prefer that all retail operations be located within the municipalities.

- 10. Close Public Hearing. Chairperson Swenson closed the Public Hearing at 9:49 am and immediately reconvened the Gunnison County Board of County Commissioners Meeting.

RESOLUTION; CREATING LICENSING REGULATIONS FOR MARIJUANA CULTIVATION, MANUFACTURING, AND TESTING FACILITIES: Moved by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to approve Resolution #2014-18, a Resolution Creating Licensing Regulations for Marijuana Cultivation, Manufacturing, and Testing Facilities with the recommended amendments discussed today. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION; AMENDING THE GUNNISON COUNTY, COLORADO LAND USE RESOLUTION WITH THE ADDITION OF SECTION: 9-104 TO REGULATE MARIJUANA CULTIVATION, MANUFACTURING, AND TESTING FACILITIES: Moved by Commissioner Houck, seconded by Commissioner Chamberland to adopt Resolution #2014-19, a Resolution Amending the Gunnison County, Colorado Land Use Resolution with the Addition of Section: 9-104 to Regulate Marijuana Cultivation, Manufacturing, and Testing Facilities, with amendments made today. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION; AMENDING THE GOLD BASIN INDUSTRIAL PARK SPECIAL AREA REGULATIONS TO ADD MARIJUANA CULTIVATION, MANUFACTURING, AND TESTING FACILITIES AS A PERMITTED USE: Moved by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to approve Resolution #2014-20, a Resolution Amending the Gold Basin Industrial Park Special Area Regulations to Add Marijuana Cultivation, Manufacturing, and Testing Facilities as a Permitted Use. Motion carried unanimously.

UNSCHEDULED CITIZENS: There were no Unscheduled Citizens present for discussion.

GUNNISON RIVER FESTIVAL: Deputy County Manager Crosby was present for this impromptu discussion, and she informed the Board that the festival was well attended and successful. There are more signs on degradation at the White Water Park as the water recedes, so her department will continue to monitor the situation. Two public meetings will take place at the end of the month to discuss the park and an upcoming Great Outdoors Colorado (GOCO) grant opportunity.

ADJOURN: Moved by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 9:54 am.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners did, on June 3, 2014 receive and review the Planning Commission's recommendation, and considered the recommendation in evaluating the request, and intends to approve the request by the adoption in full of the Planning Commission's May 16, 2014 recommendation:

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners intends to approve the transfer of any agreements currently in place with Gunnison Energy Corporation to Gunnison Energy LLC and the transfer of all Gunnison County Oil and Gas Permits issued to Gunnison Energy Corporation to Gunnison Energy LLC and;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GUNNISON COUNTY that:

All Gunnison County Oil and Gas Permits issued to Gunnison Energy Corporation, identified in the attached "Exhibit A", and all agreements with Gunnison Energy Corporation, including but not limited to the document titled *Agreement*, executed November 5, 2010 for road maintenance of County Road 265, attached as "Exhibit B", are hereby transferred to Gunnison Energy LLC, and that Gunnison Energy LLC shall comply with all conditions, terms and requirements identified in each individual Gunnison County Oil and Gas Permit; and that all such conditions, terms and requirements remain in full force and effect;

RESOLUTION NO: 14-17**

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE "GUNNISON COUNTY, COLORADO ON-SITE WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEM REGULATIONS"

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 10 of Title 25, C.R.S. and 5 CCR 1002-43 (Regulation 43), the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Gunnison, Colorado (herein the "Board") is required to adopt local on-site wastewater treatment system regulations that are as stringent as Regulation 43; and
