GUNNISON RIVER VALLEY LOCAL MARKETING DISTRICT SPECIAL MEETING:

CALL TO ORDER: Chairperson Swenson called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

SCHEDULING: The Upcoming Meetings Schedule was discussed and updated.

COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORTS:

1. Correspondence; Public Lands Partnership; Request to Co-Host a Colorado Workshop Session; 6/23/16. Commissioner Houck is the County's participating representative. **Moved** by Commissioner Houck, seconded by Commissioner Chamberland to support the partnership with the Public Lands Partnership and sponsor the events coming up with Public Lands Partnership at the water workshop. Motion carried unanimously. The County will sponsor the session identified as well as the evening reception on 6/23.
2. ICMA Conference; Kansas City, MO; 9/24. CM Birnie requested permission to attend this conference. **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to authorize (the travel). Motion carried unanimously.
3. Personnel Update. CM Birnie informed the Board that a new Administrative Assistant III has been hired for his office. Josh Ost has a degree in Political Science with concentration in Public Administration, and he is interested in learning and advancing. His first day will be 7/5.

VISITOR; BLM, GUNNISON FIELD MANAGER ELIJAH WATERS; BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENTS:
Gunnison Field Manager Elijah Waters was present for discussion.

Mr. Waters presented the revised boundary information, and he explained that the project began when State BLM Director Ruth Welch noticed a discrepancy in the size of the districts. The modifications will take effect on 10/2/16, which is the start of the state's 2017 fiscal year.

The Gunnison Field Office will absorb the entire Alpine Loop, which will now be managed within a single field office. It will also become part of the Front Range District, soon to be renamed the Rocky Mountain District, and Tom Heinlein will serve as the District Manager. The BLM's fire organizational boundaries won't be affected. Within the next year or so, the Gunnison Field Office will be moving because their current location doesn't offer enough working space.

The commissioners appreciated the information, though they expressed that they would have liked to have been involved prior to finalization. Commissioner Houck asked Mr. Waters to explain these change to the Gunnison Basin Sage-grouse Strategic Committee.

CORRESPONDENCE; GUNNISON VALLEY CHAPTER OF THE NATIONAL SOCIETY OF THE DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION: The local DAR chapter will be celebrating 100 years, and Commissioner Chamberland will plan to attend the event to represent the Board. Chairperson Swenson will draft a proclamation for consideration during the 6/21 meeting.

RESOLUTION; ESTABLISHING THE POLICY FOR APPOINTMENTS TO GUNNISON COUNTY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS, THIS RESOLUTION SUPERSEDES RESOLUTION #06-28: **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to approve Resolution #2016-22, a Resolution Establishing the Policy for Appointments to Gunnison County Boards and Commissions, This Resolution Supersedes Resolution #06-28. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION; ADJUSTING GROUND RENT FOR USE OF PREMISES AT THE GOLD BASIN INDUSTRIAL PARK: **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to approve Resolution #2016-23, a Resolution Adjusting Ground Rent for Use of Premises at the Gold Basin Industrial Park. Motion carried unanimously.

BREAK: The meeting recessed from 9:44 until 9:47 am for a short break.

RESOLUTION; APPROVING AN ADDENDUM TO AMENDMENT TO THE DECLARATION OF PROTECTIVE COVENANTS OF GLACIER LILY ESTATES: Attorney David Leinsdorf was present for discussion.

Commissioner Houck asked if the lot identified was the one that was contested previously, and Mr. Leinsdorf explained that it was and it an exception would be in place for as long as the property is owned by the current owner. **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to approve Resolution #2016-24, a Resolution Approving an Addendum to Amendment to the Declaration of Protective Covenants of Glacier Lily Estates as presented here today. Motion carried unanimously.

COMPRESSED NATURAL GAS FUELING STATION PARTNERSHIP; POSSIBLE EXECUTIVE SESSION: County Attorney David Baumgarten and Facilities and Grounds Manager John Cattles were present for discussion. CM Birnie recommended that he and the Board enter an executive session with CA Baumgarten and FGM Cattles. CA Baumgarten explained that the executive session would be based on C.R.S. 24-6-402(4)(a)(b)(e)(I) and that, because it would involve attorney-client privileged information, no contemporaneous electronic record would be kept. **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to enter the executive session as described. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board came out of executive session at 10:20 am. Chairperson Swenson confirmed that the discussion remained on-topic, that all parties stated to be in attendance were, in fact, in attendance, and that no decisions were made. **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to direct and authorize the County Manager to continue with contract negotiations with Trillium for a CNG filling station, and to authorize him to expend funds and sign docs for those negotiations. Motion carried unanimously.

AMENDMENTS TO DESIGN GUIDELINES; SADDLE RIDGE RANCH ESTATES; RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE DESIGN GUIDELINES OF SADDLE RIDGE RANCH ESTATES:

Assistant Community Development Director Neal Starkebaum, Community Development Director Russ Forrest and Dan Murphy, representing the HOA, were present for discussion.

ACDD Starkebaum explained that changes to this subdivisions' guidelines must be approved by the Board. Mr. Murphy explained the changes that were outlined in his 5/12/16 correspondence, which was included in the meeting portfolio. **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to approve Resolution #2016-25, a Resolution Approving Amendments to the Design Guidelines of Saddle Ridge Ranch Estates. Motion carried unanimously.

PETITIONS FOR ABATEMENT OR REFUND OF TAXES: CA Baumgarten and Senior Assessment Analyst William Spicer were present for discussion.

CA Baumgarten urged that the petitions, all related to the Reserve Metropolitan District #2 mill levy issue, be granted and that the RMD pay for the refunds with interest. A potential agreement was received a couple of days ago, and he and his staff are reviewing it. He asked for permission to execute the agreement if it is determined that all petitioners, including those who petition by the end of this year, are refunded by the RMD with interest. All of the petitioners or their representatives have agreed to continue these hearings until July or August and after the agreement between the County and the RMD has been executed. If the agreement is not executed and the necessary funding is not deposited into an escrow account to fund the refunds, CA Baumgarten noted that he would then recommend that the petitions be denied so that the petitioners could then pursue legal action in the court system. He confirmed that the County has authority to intercept the funding on behalf of the petitioners. **Moved** by Commissioner Chamberland, seconded by Commissioner Houck to continue the Petitions for Abatement or Refund of Taxes for legal property descriptions presented here today on our agenda to a date in the future when staff is able to work out an agreement with the District for funding the distribution. Motion carried unanimously.

2. Gunnison Valley Rural Transportation Authority. Chairperson Swenson informed the Board that the RTA is working to load winter flights. Commissioner Chamberland questioned whether or not the RTA can put pressure on United to get a good operator for the Denver leg, and Chairperson Swenson stated that they are working on that.

RESOLUTION NO: 16-21**

A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO: 06-29, *A RESOLUTION INCORPORATING CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY INTO THE GUNNISON-CRESTED BUTTE REGIONAL AIRPORT*

WHEREAS, on May 2, 2006 the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Gunnison, Colorado adopted Resolution No: 06-29, *A Resolution Incorporating Certain Real Property Into the Gunnison-Crested Butte Regional Airport*; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No: 06-29 incorporated certain real property into the Gunnison-Crested Butte Regional Airport and subjected that real property to Federal Aviation Administration requirements and restrictions; and

WHEREAS, a certain portion of real property was inadvertently included in the legal description identified in Resolution No: 06-29 and was designated to be part of the Gunnison-Crested Butte Regional Airport and subject to Federal Aviation Administration requirements and restrictions; and

WHEREAS, that certain portion of real property inadvertently included in Resolution No: 06-29 is described as follows:

Lots 1 through 4, inclusive and Lots 23 through 26, inclusive, Block 2 and Lots 23 through 26, inclusive, Block 3, all according to the official plat of RIO GRANDE ADDITION to the City of Gunnison, Colorado, on file and of record in the office of the County Clerk and Recorder of Gunnison County, Colorado ("Real Property"); and

WHEREAS, it would be appropriate to exclude the Real Property from being designated as part of the Gunnison-Crested Butte Regional Airport and subject to the same Federal Aviation Administration requirements and restrictions; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Gunnison County, Colorado, that Resolution No: 06-29, *A Resolution Incorporating Certain Real Property Into the Gunnison-Crested Butte Regional Airport* shall be and hereby is amended to exclude the following real property from the designation of being part of the Gunnison-Crested Butte Regional Airport and from being subject to the same Federal Aviation Administration requirements and restrictions:

Lots 1 through 4, inclusive and Lots 23 through 26, inclusive, Block 2 and Lots 23 through 26, inclusive, Block 3, all according to the official plat of RIO GRANDE ADDITION to the City of Gunnison, Colorado, on file and of record in the office of the County Clerk and Recorder of Gunnison County, Colorado.

RESOLUTION #2016-22**

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE POLICY FOR APPOINTMENTS TO GUNNISON COUNTY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS; THIS RESOLUTION SUPERSEDES RESOLUTION #06-28

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Gunnison County, Colorado has the authority to appoint members to various Gunnison County boards and commissions; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to establish a policy to ensure that the appointment process:

- o Will be timely;
- o Will foster applications for open positions;
- o Will be open to public scrutiny;
- o Will comply with applicable legal requirements; and
- o Will result in appointments that are in the best interests of Gunnison County;

WHEREAS, the appointment process established by this Resolution shall apply to appointments to the following boards and commissions:

- a. Board of Adjustments
- b. Board of Appeals
- c. Colorado River Water Conservation District Board
- d. Commissioner of Deeds
- e. Community Corrections Board
- f. Environmental Health Board
- g. Extension Advisory Committee
- h. Gunnison Basin Sage-grouse Strategic Committee
- i. Gunnison Cemetery District Board
- j. Gunnison Sage-grouse Mitigation Committee
- k. Gunnison Valley Hospital Board of Trustees
- l. Gunnison Valley Housing Foundation Board
- m. Gunnison Valley Observatory Board
- n. Gunnison-Crested Butte Tourism Association Board
- o. HB 1177 Roundtable
- p. Historic Preservation Commission
- q. Land Preservation Board
- r. Library Board of Trustees
- s. Medical Health Officer
- t. Planning Commission
- u. Region 10 Board
- v. Trails Commission
- w. Veterans Service Officer
- x. Watershed Weed Commission
- y. Western Regional EMS Council
- z. Other boards and commissions as identified from time to time by the Board of County Commissioners

WHEREAS, the appointment process established by this Resolution shall be followed unless the process is in conflict with a specific requirement of an applicable ordinance, statute, established resolution of the Board, or other legal requirement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Gunnison County, Colorado that the procedure for advertisement, interview, and appointment of persons to vacancies on boards and commissions shall occur by the following process except in unusual circumstances, such as those dictated by statute or specific bylaws (see Section 7 below):

Annual Appointment Process:

1. Notification:
 - a. Prior to or at the time of issuance of the annual vacancy notice, County staff members and/or the chairperson involved with each board or commission will be advised of upcoming vacancies and asked to encourage citizens to apply who have the appropriate interest, commitment, and skills.
 - b. Prior to or at the time of issuance of the annual vacancy notice, persons whose terms are expiring will be informed of their term expiration, thanked for their service, and encouraged to reapply.
2. Vacancy Notices and Applications:
 - a. Annual Board requests for applications for appointment shall be made via newspaper, the County website, and/or the County's social media outlets; and
 - b. The vacancy notice shall be issued no later than December 1st with a response deadline of January 15th at 5:00 p.m., or the first business day thereafter.
3. Scheduling/Conducting Interviews and Making Appointments:
 - a. Interviews shall not commence until after the response deadline. Notification of interview date and time will be made by letter, phone or email to applicants.
 - b. Incumbent applicants will be advised that the interview is conducted for both an interview and opportunity for the applicant to update the Board on activities of that board or commission.
4. Re-notification:
 - a. After the first round of appointments are made, the Board may opt to pursue a second round of appointments by following the same process as stated above, but for only three weeks for any specific board or commission vacancies remaining.
5. Recruitment:
 - a. After two rounds of interviews and appointments, County staff members and/or the chairperson involved with each board or commission will be advised of remaining vacancies

and asked to recruit applicants. If this process yields interested applicants, interviews and appointments will be scheduled.

- 6. Out-of-Cycle Applications and Vacancies:
 - a. If a resignation and/or other creation of a vacancy occurs outside of the annual cycle outlined above, the Board may elect to create and follow a one-time recruitment and appointment schedule to fill that vacancy.
- 7. Special Circumstances Dictated by Bylaws and/or Statute:
 - a. Colorado River Water Conservation District. In compliance with CRS 37-46-104, the Board shall make its regular appointment to the Colorado River Water Conservation District during its first meeting in January. The County Clerk or a Deputy County Clerk will administer the Oath of Office to the newly appointed (or reappointed) person, and that appointee shall take office beginning on the third Tuesday in January.
 - b. Gunnison Valley Hospital Board of Trustees. In compliance with CRS 25-3-303 and the Gunnison Valley Hospital Board of Trustees bylaws, the Board shall make regular appointments to the Gunnison Valley Hospital Board of Trustees on or before the second Tuesday of January.
