10:03:23 AM CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Stahlnecker called the April 15, 2015 meeting of the Gunnison Basin Sage-grouse Strategic Committee to order at 10:00 A.M.

DETERMINATION OF QUORUM: Stahlnecker confirmed that a quorum was present.

10:03:13 AM PUBLIC NOTICE CONFIRMED: Stahlnecker verified that proper legal public notice had occurred.

10:03:17 AM AGENDA APPROVAL: One modification to the agenda. March 2015 meeting minutes were rescheduled to the May meeting. Some of the Committee members were unable to access these on the website.

10:03:10 AM APPROVAL of March 18, 2015 MEETING MINUTES: Rescheduled to May 20, 2015 meeting.

10:04:52 AM COMMITTEE MEMBER COMMENTS/ REPORTS

Japuntich indicated that the current temporary acting BLM Gunnison Field Office Manager Justin Abernathy. Justin is from Utah. He will be in this position for the next 60 days.

Laurie reported that at Poncha Pass there are 11 documented birds and they have seen six. Concern was expressed that a private individual was spotted in this area. He was on the highway and not on the closed road viewing grouse on the lek. Seward reported on lekking activity in the Gunnison Basin. First count period recorded 684 males and 184 females. This is already above last year's high male count. Lekking activity started earlier. Very encouraging. Wildlife photographer Bob Gress was introduced. Mr. Gress and Seward went to a private lek up Ohio Creek to provide Mr. Gress with a photography opportunity. Seward counted 81 males at this lek. They were able to get some great photos

Japuntich reported that the BLM State Director, Ruth Welch and staff, had visited the same private lek last week.

Japuntich also reported that the BLM "sheep allotment" EIS process is underway. It does include several allotments in Gunnison sage-grouse habitat. *Initial public scoping is being accomplished.*

Cochran asked about any road closure issues. Japuntich indicated that the issues are small now. The antler collection season is pretty much over.

10:11:19 AM LITIGATION UPDATE

Cochran presented his update. The Gunnison County BoCC approved intervention in the three lawsuits that have been filed to date. So far, all but one claimant has agreed not to object to intervention in the respective cases by Gunnison County and the Gunnison County Stockgrowers' Association. One motion to intervene will be filed shortly. Two of the claims (State of Colorado and Center for Biological Diversity/Western Watersheds Project (CBD/WWP) have been amended. Motions to intervene in those cases have therefore been delayed. The State and the County plans were discussed. It is likely that the Court will combine all of the cases into a single proceeding.

Houck stated that they are unsure how this will all work.

Cochran stated that the Federal Government should have their answer to the pro-listing (as endangered) lawsuits by May 12, 2015, though the amended CDB/WWP complaint will require an extension of that date.

10:16:31 AM BLM RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PLAN AMENDMENT EIS

Espy unable to attend. Japuntich commenced his review. The final record of decision is scheduled for February 2017. Draft chapters 2, 3, 4 will be out for Cooperating Agency review by May, 2015. Looks like full review draft will be available by July, 2015. Content was discussed.

Navy questioned the long timing. Japuntich indicated the 90 day comment periods were making it long. This really is going faster than most EIS's. Upcoming meetings discussed.

10:21:54 AM WAUNITA WATCHABLE WILDLIFE SITE

Seward started this discussion. Times for viewing were brought up, using the indicators in the report. A draft report prepared by Magee and Seward was distributed and discussed. Times and various days for counting were reviewed.

Magee discussed the high number levels for the males. Average is 38.3.

Magee stated that the birds have changed their location from prior years. Viewers are still able to see the birds from the viewing site even though they are farther away. This does cause less stress on the population. The counts they are getting are conservative. They have counted 29 combined male & females at this time.

The count locations have been divided into the traditional area, north meadow and the East Ridge. Japuntich brought up the up and down counts in this area. He asked if this consistent with the other leks. Human disturbance was discussed.

Laurie asked if vehicles were going beyond this area to look at the birds. Magee responded that yes there have been a few. Magee sent out some educational information regarding this and they have had a good response.

Navy asked if they should wait for the proposed number to be arrived at or initiate changes now.

Magee responded that this was discussed as far as eliminating days. Magee indicated that since the birds are far enough away that this may not be an issue.

Closing off of roads and the other issues involved with this practice was discussed by Houck.

Magee indicated that the birds may have solved this problem by relocating to a more secure area. The traditional lek in the middle of the meadow may not be the primary area anymore.

Navy indicated that the birders may look to other sites if no birds are seen in listed approved areas. Seward indicated that CPW will not look to install another turn off.

Cochran indicated that this was what Seward and Magee have compiled for this meeting. This will be brought up at another meeting. Providing a controlled outlet for lek viewing was the intent when the Waunita site was identified an approved. Moving the location may not be the answer. Birders know the importance of this time. This site was never meant to be a photographer's site. It is a watchable wildlife site. The three year average was discussed.

10:45:03 AM GUNNISON SAGE- GROUSE BROCHURES

The brochures were passed out and the committee reviewed the contents for corrections. Name changes, phone number changes, website changes were discussed.

Navy indicated that this could be updated and taken to the printers for immediate update and preparation for printing. Brochure supplies are low and this needs to be completed soon.

Seward indicated that the some of the images were inferior. He passed out some posters and images of Mr. Gress' work.

Navy will make the necessary corrections that were reviewed.

Houck wanted the edits to be made and then reviewed by this committee prior to printing.

Mr. Gress discussed how the Nature Center did their posters and brochures. He indicated that he would donate his pictures and help arrange the brochures.

Cochran indicated that the changes will be made and then sent to all members prior to the next meeting.

Funds were discussed for this.

Magee brought up the summit and the festival and the possible differences.

Laurie asked about funding and where can we get the money for this update.

Citizen in the audience asked about the partners and additional funding available with these organizations.

Wiens verified the balance of \$1,730.00 was in the Gunnison Trails account, leftover from the last Festival

Vasquez discussed the history of the bird and other species and how sagebrush supports these birds.

Mr. Gress discussed the layout and costs of the posters.

Pelizza asked about access to the PDF files for this and who will do the layout and editing. Gress needs the basic text and he could assist with this.

Brochure will be revised/completed first.

Funding for the festival was discussed.

Sources of funding was discussed.

11:12:52 AM FUTURE MEETINGS: Future meetings will occur on the 3rd Wednesday of the month in the Planning Commission meeting room, located at 221 N. Wisconsin, Gunnison, Co. 81230, unless changed for a specific reason.

Cochran indicated that we have been doing many reviews on parcels at this time. The Habitat Prioritization Tool is being used extensively by Gunnison County. The occupied habitat polygon was discussed. Lek status affects scores. The Tool needs to be updated using current data. Vasquez will convene a meeting of the Technical Subcommittee to discuss updating the Habitat Prioritization Tool.

Japuntich noted that reclaimed roads need to be updated in the Tool.

Various measures used to update were discussed.

Wiens asked if the restoration is being tracked.

Seward indicated that the official lek status is updated by CPW annually. Lek polygons are updated by CPW periodically. Three consecutive years need to be the basis for the tool.

Cochran would like to have this tool under review by June 1st. Vasquez will send out an email to set an initial meeting. Shooting for a time at the end of May 2015.

Pelizza indicated that they have a recommended selection for the Colorado Field Supervisor. FWS has published a vacancy announcement for a Gunnison sage-grouse biologist position. A draft 4d rule to be published in early May. It is in their review process now. New notice of intent to sue has also been received, from the Colorado Cattleman's Association and Colorado Farm Bureau and two other groups.

Navy asked how long the comment period for the draft 4d rule was. Pelizza answered 30 days.
