GUNNISON COUNTY LOCAL LIQUOR LICENSING AUTHORITY:

CALL TO ORDER: Chairperson Houck called the Gunnison County Local Liquor Licensing Authority meeting to order at 8:55 am, due to a technical delay.

ALCOHOL BEVERAGE LICENSE #03-13185; SKYHIGHCOLORADO, LLC DBA NUGGET CAFE; EFFECTIVE DATES 4/6/2021 - 4/6/2022: With no questions or concerns noted by the Commissioners, it was **moved** by Commissioner Houck, seconded by Commissioner Smith, to approve the liquor license as presented and authorize the Chair's signature. Motion carried unanimously.

ADJOURN: Commissioner Houck adjourned the Gunnison County Local Liquor Licensing Authority at 8:56 am.

GUNNISON RIVER VALLEY LOCAL MARKETING DISTRICT:

CALL TO ORDER: Chairperson Houck called the Gunnison River Valley Local Marketing District meeting to order at 8:56 am.

LOCAL MARKETING DISTRICT FUNDING REQUEST; MARBLE CRYSTAL RIVER CHAMBER OF COMMERCE: EFFECTIVE DATES 1/1/2021 THRU 12/31/2021; \$25,500: Due to some members of the Chamber of Commerce not being able to join in remotely at that time, Chairperson Houck elected to move this to the end of the meeting, and continue with the next agenda items.

ADJOURN: Commissioner Houck adjourned the Gunnison River Valley Local Marketing District at 8:57 am.

GUNNISON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING:

CALL TO ORDER: Chairperson Houck called the Gunnison County Board of County Commissioners Regular Meeting to order at 8:57 am.

AGENDA REVIEW: There were no changes made to the agenda, other than noting the later times for the meeting that day.

MINUTES APPROVAL: With two changes to the February 2, 2021 minutes – one change noted by Commissioner Smith to Commissioner Items, and the addition of clarifying language by Deputy County Attorney (DCA) Emilee Gaebler – it was **moved** by Commissioner Houck, seconded by Commissioner Smith, to approve the meeting minutes with those corrections made to the record. Motion carried unanimously.

CONSENT AGENDA: With no questions or concerns by the Board, it was **moved** by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Mason, to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

SCHEDULING: No changes were noted during a review of the upcoming schedule of meetings.

COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORTS: County Manager Matthew Birnie was not present that day, so the Board moved to the Deputy County Manager's Report and Project Updates.

DEPUTY COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT AND PROJECT UPDATES: Deputy County Manager Marlene Crosby was present for discussion.

1. Request for Approval; Gunnison Nordic Fundraiser Ride on Cottonwood Pass; May 28, 2021. DCM Marlene Crosby explained that the ride would not need a road closure, as the fundraiser ride would be scheduled right before the official opening of Cottonwood Pass. Also present via Zoom was Joellen Fonken, representing Gunnison Nordic. She explained that Gunnison Nordic did not want to promote this fundraiser until they had the direction and approval from the Board. The possibility for an annual ride would be entertained, depending on how it worked out on this first year. DCM Crosby amended the date, saying that it would be May 27th instead, as this was the Thursday which Gunnison Nordic requested for the ride. Insurance for the ride was also discussed, and Joellen agreed to check into acquiring this. With the need for insurance noted, the Board approved Gunnison Nordic to go ahead with planning their fundraiser ride on May 27, 2021.

Change of Agenda: Because of timing, Chairperson Houck moved the Public Hearing and corresponding Log Cluster items ahead, in order to be closer to the 9:00 am that had been posted on the Public Notice.

PUBLIC HEARING; ALLEY VACATION REQUEST; LOTS 6-13, BLOCK 19, IRWIN, COLORADO; JUSTIN HASTINGS AND TRACY WILLIAMS HASTINGS:

1. Open of Public Hearing: Commissioner Houck opened the Public Hearing at 9:10 am.
2. Public Notice Confirmation: Public Notice was confirmed by Deputy County Manager Marlene Crosby.
3. Identify Ex Parte Communications: There were no ex parte communications identified.
4. Staff Presentation: DCM Crosby explained that this is an alley vacation that was needed for septic installation.
5. Board Questions: There were no questions from the Board.
6. Public Comments: There were no public comments.
7. Acknowledge Correspondence Received: There was no correspondence received.
8. Applicant Response: N/A
9. Close Public Hearing: Commissioner Houck closed the public hearing at 9:13 am.

Moved by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Mason to adopt Resolution 2021-9, a Resolution Vacating a Certain Portion of Alley Lying Within the Townsite of Irwin, County of Gunnison, State of Colorado. Motion carried unanimously.

LOT CLUSTER AGREEMENT AND DECLARATION; LOTS 6-13, BLOCK 19, ADJACENT PORTION OF THE ALLEY IN BLOCK 19, AND ADJACENT PORTION OF 11TH STREET, IRWIN TOWNSITE; JUSTIN HASTINGS AND TRACY WILLIAMS HASTINGS:

Beth Baker of Community Development presented the lot cluster via Zoom. Beth explained that the Hastings were required to do this lot cluster in order to obtain their alley vacation. Everything was approved by the County Attorney and the Community Development Director; the taxes were current, and there were no liens on the property, or any Home Owners Association. With no questions by the Board, Chairperson Houck **moved** to approve the Lot Cluster Agreement and Declaration; Lots 6-13, Block 19, Adjacent Portion of the Alley in Block 19, and Adjacent Portion of 11th Street, Irwin Townsite; Justin Hastings and Tracy Williams Hastings, as presented, and authorize the signature of the Board. Seconded by Commissioner Smith. Motion carried unanimously.

Change of Agenda: Chairperson Houck then moved back to the skipped items on the agenda.

VOUCHERS AND TRANSFERS: CFO Juan Guerra and Senior Accountant Kelly Weak were available in person for the Vouchers and Transfers reports.

1. Accounts Payable Report – March 2021: With no questions from the Board, it was **moved** by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Mason, to approve the voucher for \$1,497,901.34. Motion carried unanimously.
2. Cash Transfer Report - March 2021: With no questions from the Board, it was **moved** by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Mason, to approve the cash transfer of \$3,093,890.70. Motion carried unanimously.
3. Sales Tax and Local Marketing District Tax Reports - February 2021

TREASURER'S REPORT – MARCH 2021: Treasurer Debbie Dunbar was not present that day. With no issues from the Board, Chairperson Houck **moved** to accept the Treasurer's Report and authorize the Chair's signature. Commissioner Smith seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

LETTER OF SUPPORT; TOWN OF CRESTED BUTTE FUNDING APPLICATION; COLORADO RIVER DISTRICT; IRWIN VALVE INFRASTRUCTURE: With Commissioner Mason expressing support for this project, and with no further questions, Commissioner Smith **moved** to approve the Letter of Support for the Town of Crested Butte Funding Application, and authorize the Chair's signature. Commissioner Mason seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

REGION 10 BUSINESS LOAN FUND, OUT-OF-CYCLE APPOINTMENT; SHANE MCGUINNESS:

Chairperson Houck explained that Gunnison County did not have a representative for consideration to the Region 10 Business Loan Fund. Shane McGuinness had held the position in the past, and reached out to volunteer to serve in that capacity once again. Chairperson Houck noted that, with no representative in place, the Board was authorized to make the out-of-cycle appointment. Both Commissioner Mason and Commissioner Smith expressed their support of Shane McGuinness, adding that his past experience and knowledge of businesses in the area would be excellent qualifications for his appointment. With no further discussion, Commissioner Smith **moved** to appoint Shane McGuinness as the Gunnison County representative to the Region 10 Business Loan Fund Committee. Commissioner Mason seconded. Chairperson noted for the record that, though this appointment was out-of-cycle at the beginning of the appointment, the ending of his term would go back to the regular cycle timing, and would not be extended past. Motion carried unanimously. Chairperson Houck asked Commissioner Mason, as the Region 10 representative for Gunnison County, to assist Shane McGuinness in catching up with their meeting schedule and events.

2018-2019 AMSTAR PETITION FOR ABATEMENT OR REFUND OF TAXES HEARING: At 9:22 am, Chairperson Houck noted that we were three minutes ahead of schedule, and upon finding that no one was present to represent Amstar Inc., he then phoned the number on the petition application, as a courtesy, to see if the petitioner, David McEntire, would want to be present via phone. The person at that number stated there was no one there for Amstar and they did not know a McEntire. Further, they asserted that they had this phone number for some time, so we must have been given a wrong number.

With this contact attempt attempted, Chairperson elected to open the hearing at 9:25 am. County Assessor Charles McDonald presented in person. He presented four comparable residences with similar 35-acre tracts and Crested Butte locations for the tax year 2018; and likewise, four like comparable residences for Tax Year 2019. He stated that the petitioner did submit examples as well, but noted that the petitioner's examples were not within a relevant time frame. County Assessor McDonald concluded that he did recommend to lower the 2018 taxes, based on an error found in the agricultural land calculations for that year. The correct adjustment to calculations had been made for the 2019 tax year, so County Assessor McDonald recommended that they deny the abatement or refund of taxes for 2019.

With a few questions confirming the differences between the two different tax years, it was decided to make two separate motions for each tax year. Chairperson Houck **moved** to make an adjustment to the Amstar petition for abatement on the 2018 evaluation, reducing the original valuation of \$1,862,270 to a corrected \$1,823,170. Commissioner Smith seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

After checking the stance of the Board members, Chairperson Houck then further **moved** to deny the Amstar petition for abatement or refund of taxes for the tax year 2019, based on the information as presented there that day. Commissioner Smith seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Houck recessed the regular meeting at 9:41 a.m., in order to go in to an executive session.

EXECUTIVE SESSION, PURSUANT TO C.R.S. 24-6-402(4)(E)(I), FOR DETERMINING POSITIONS RELATIVE TO MATTERS THAT MAY BE SUBJECT TO NEGOTIATIONS RELATED TO UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS PERMIT NO. SPK-2019-00889, DEVELOPING STRATEGY FOR NEGOTIATIONS, AND INSTRUCTING NEGOTIATORS, AND PURSUANT TO C.R.S. 24-6-402 (4) (B) CONFERENCES WITH THE COUNTY ATTORNEY OR DEPUTY COUNTY ATTORNEY FOR GUNNISON COUNTY FOR THE PURPOSE OF RECEIVING LEGAL ADVICE:

Chairperson Houck **moved** to enter into Executive Session, pursuant to C.R.S. 24-6-402 (4) (e) (I), for determining positions relative to matters that may be subject to negotiations related to United States Army Corps of Engineers Permit No. SPK-2019-00889, developing strategy for negotiations, and instructing negotiators, and pursuant to C.R.S. 24-6-402 (4) (b) conferences with the County Attorney or Deputy County Attorney for Gunnison County for the purpose of receiving legal advice. Those who would be participating in the executive session included Commissioners Houck and Smith in person, Commissioner Mason by telephone, Deputy County Manager Marlene Crosby, and Deputy County Attorney Emilee Gaebler. Commissioner Smith seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board went into executive session at 9:42 a.m. The executive session was held in the Administration Meeting Room, and no contemporaneous records were kept. *Executive sessions of the Board of County Commissioners are conducted as per C.R.S. §24-6-402(4). This specific session was conducted as per §24-6-402 (4) (E) (I).*

Upon returning to the meeting room, it was **moved** by Chairperson Houck to come out of executive session, affirming that the participants in the executive session remained consistent with those read into the record, and that they did stay on track in the discussion. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion, and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Houck adjourned the Executive Session at 10:07 am.

GUNNISON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING:

RECONVENE: At 10:08 am, Commissioner Houck reconvened the Gunnison County Board of County Commissioners Regular Meeting.

Chairperson Houck then directed Deputy County Attorney Gaebler to continue negotiations with the Army Corps of Engineers, and noted that they would continue to work on this until they came to a resolution that is acceptable.

UNSCHEDULED CITIZENS: There were no Unscheduled Citizens present for discussion.

COMMISSIONER ITEMS:

Commissioner Mason:

- 1. Met with Region 10 Executive Staff last week. They were looking into hiring a new broadband director and the group looked through applications. Commissioner Mason noted that he would let the Board know who was hired, as soon as that transpired.

Commissioner Smith:

- 1. Attended the Chamber of Commerce meeting last Friday, April 16. Topics discussed were Board resources, the business community, and several exciting, upcoming projects. Commissioner Smith noted that Pam William’s leadership was really moving the Chamber in a positive direction.

Commissioner Houck:

- 1. Attended a Sustainable Tourism and Outdoor Recreation (STOR) committee meeting last week. Revisited the Town of Crested Butte’s decision to close the RV dump station. A request was made to the Town of CB to reconsider the closure of the dump station. Commissioner Houck noted that a long-term solution in the valley is important and a subcommittee was working on this with the Town of CB.
- 2. Along with all the Board, he attended the groundbreaking for the new library, last Wednesday, April 14th. Commissioner Houck wanted to express a huge “Thank You” to the community who voted to provide long-term funding for the operation of the Library District. This would allow the County to take the yearly funding that they had been providing – worth up to \$900,000 per year – and commit it to building the new building, and then retiring that debt. He also noted that voter approval allowed for expansion to other areas like Crested Butte, and to groups like seniors and young children.
- 3. Met with Harman Rocks User Group. Commissioner Houck noted the great turnout for the Hartman’s cleanup. The valley-wide community showed up.
- 4. Participated in a discussion with a group of citizens in Gunnison, updating them on where we are with a State Park application that has been submitted to the State. Commissioner Houck noted that presently there are 38 nominations submitted for state parks, but was sure that some of these would be weeded out right away.
- 5. Legislatively, all the Board has been involved with Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP), Colorado Counties, Inc (CCI) or Club 20. Also, they are keeping their eye on seeing how the state-wide transportation bill progresses.

6. Commissioner Houck, along with the other Board members, have individually contacted the Colorado Second Congressional District representative, to express their support for the proposal for a modernized Civil Conservation Corp. It would back wildlife, endangered and threatened wild species, agriculture and grazing rights, among other things. The Board feels this would be a great fit for Gunnison county.
7. Met with Facilities and Ground Director, John Cattles, and Community and Economic Development Director, Cathy Pagano. They discussed the progress being made on Shady Island River Resort, and Commissioner Houck noted he was looking forward to the amenities that will be made available to the community, hopefully in June.

Deputy County Manager Updates (cont'd):

2. DCM Marlene Crosby wanted to follow-up on a question asked previously by Commissioner Mason, regarding Kebler Pass vehicle lengths. She was able to measure the length of a vehicle with a trailer that was sized to haul a small excavator. This length came to 49 feet – just under the 50-foot restriction being considered for the Pass.
3. Asked the Board to consider a future agenda topic. DCM Crosby let the Board know there was funding being released that was designated to the fairgrounds. She wanted them to consider not dividing it up among individual groups this time. Instead, DCM Crosby was hoping to be able to give it to the fairground for improvements that would benefit all of the non-profit groups and general users of the fairgrounds. She added that she could not get this item on the next week's work session agenda, but that it would hopefully be on the meeting after that in May.
4. DCM Marlene Crosby wanted to set a date for a visit to Marble and the quarry there. Asking the Board about when to schedule, they found that June was very full, with the work session for June 8th to be cancelled, as all the Board would be either at conferences, or on vacation. They decided to look at scheduling a work session after the June 15th regular meeting, with the possibility of meeting with the Marble Town Council while there. DCM Crosby said she would look into the options and get back with more details.

COMMISSIONER ITEMS (cont'd):

Commissioner Houck:

1. Met with Facilities and Ground Director, John Cattles, to go over the results of passive solar installation on some of the county buildings. Commissioner Houck was very gratified to hear that on very sunny days, the new courthouse building and Health and Human Services building were able to produce as much energy as they consumed. Likewise, the Blackstock building, though older, was able to see a significant contribution to the amount of energy being produced. He stated that this was a climate change issue, and was at the heart of being environmentally responsible. It was also encouraging, in light of the plans for solar on the new airport parking areas.
2. Reminder that the airport parking groundbreaking happens next week. Before, they are reconfiguring the area, allowing them to continue when the renno

ADJOURN: **Moved** by Chairperson Houk, seconded by Commissioner Smith, to adjourn the Gunnison County Board of Commissioners Regular Meeting. Motion carried unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 10:23 am.

BREAK: There was a short recess from 10:23 am to 10:28 am.

GUNNISON/HINSDALE BOARD OF HUMAN SERVICES REGULAR MEETING: This separate meeting was held from 10:28 am to 10:59 am.

GUNNISON COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH REGULAR MEETING:

CALL TO ORDER: Chairperson Houck called the meeting to order as the Gunnison County Board of Health at 10:59 am. Health and Human Services Director Joni Reynolds was present for discussion.

COVID-19 UPDATE: HHS Director Reynolds updated the Board on the State of Colorado's COVID average Daily Case Counts across the months, with an ongoing average trend of cases. The trends since the first of the year showed a spike in number of cases in January, with it going down and experiencing a smaller spike in March 2021. As far as Variants of concern in the state, the UK and California strains were of most concern; the UK strain numbers exploded since the first of 2021, and the California strain was showing resistance to treatment. Gunnison County was still seeing positive tests throughout the past month. The most recent data on vaccinations showed Gunnison County with 51% of its population fully vaccinated, and 63% having received at least one dose. This was well above the State of Colorado (25% / 40%) and national (35% / 50%) averages.

Recent surveys of those in Gunnison County who had cancelled their vaccination appointments, found that many had received their second vaccination elsewhere. A survey was also taken of those who had not yet gotten their vaccinations. When asked why not, the main reason was that the clinic times were all held

during their work hours. As a result, HHS Director Reynolds said they were adjusting some of their clinics to accommodate for this. Gunnison County HHS has set a goal of 10,000 vaccinated by the end of May.

Future considerations were also mentioned. These included such topics as such as: getting vaccinations to the younger populations (those 16 years of age and under); how to continue case management – identification, testing, treatment, vaccination – while keeping it affordable and easily accessible; and changes in risk locally, across the State, and across the Nation.

ADJOURN: Technical difficulties at the end of the meeting caused those on Zoom to lose connection, so Commissioner Houck called an end to the meeting, and **moved** to adjourn at that point. Commissioner Smith seconded. Motion carried unanimously. The meeting adjourned as the Gunnison County Board of Health at 11:40 am.

RESOLUTION NO: 2021 – 9

A RESOLUTION VACATING A CERTAIN PORTION OF ALLEY LYING WITHIN THE TOWNSITE OF IRWIN, COUNTY OF GUNNISON, STATE OF COLORADO

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Gunnison, Colorado, ("Board"), by virtue of Colorado law, has authority and is the owner of certain roads and alleys lying within the County of Gunnison; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that not all platted roads and alleys are necessary for public access to privately owned property; and

WHEREAS, the Board has received a request to vacate a certain portion of an alley lying within the Townsite of Irwin, County of Gunnison, State of Colorado describe as follows:

That certain portion of alley adjacent to Lots 6 through 9, inclusive, and Lots 10 through 13, inclusive, Block 19, lying within the Townsite of Irwin, according to the official plat recorded in the records of the Office of the Clerk and Recorder of Gunnison County, Colorado on September 6, 1894, bearing Reception No: 70551; and

WHEREAS, the vacation of the above described portion of alley lying within the Townsite of Irwin, will not hinder any property owners of any lands from having access to their respective land nor disrupt existing travel modes or anticipated conditions in traffic or development patterns; and

WHEREAS, there will be no adverse impact to the natural environment, community needs or public health, safety and welfare from the vacation of the above described portion of alley lying within the Townsite of Irwin; and

WHEREAS, the notices required by Colorado law for such vacation have been give and a public hearing on such vacation has been conducted; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Gunnison, Colorado that the certain portion of alley lying within the Townsite of Irwin, County of Gunnison, State of Colorado described as follows shall be and hereby is vacated:

That certain portion of alley adjacent to Lots 6 through 9, inclusive, and Lots 10 through 13, inclusive, Block 19, lying within the Townsite of Irwin, according to the official plat recorded in the records of the Office of the Clerk and Recorder of Gunnison County, Colorado on September 6, 1894, bearing Reception No: 70551.

It is the specific intent of the Board that the vacation of the above described portion of alley lying within the Townsite of Irwin shall accrue to and vest in the record owner(s) of adjacent real property pursuant to the provisions of C.R.S. § 43-2-302.

FUTHERMORE, this Resolution is contingent upon and shall not become effective until the recording in the records of the Office of the Clerk and Recorder of Gunnison County, Colorado of the following:

1. The Lot Cluster Agreement executed by Gunnison County and the owner(s) of the respective adjacent property clustering said property and the above described portion of alley lying within the Townsite of Irwin, County of Gunnison, State of Colorado; and
2. This Resolution.

INTRODUCED by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Mason, and adopted this 20 day of April, 2021.
